FOKE Meets with new Ku-ring-gai MP Alister Henskens

The Friends of Ku-ring-gai Environment (FOKE) formally met, for the first time, with Ku-ring-gai Member of Parliament Mr Alister Henskens on Wednesday 19th August at his Wahroonga Office.

FOKE has requested that the new Ku-ring-gai MP, Mr Henskens arrange a tour of Ku-ring-gai with the Minister for Planning, Mr Rob Stokes and Minister for the Environment Mr Mark Speakman.

Kathy Cowley, President of FOKE said that the site tour was important.

"We need to demonstrate and highlight Ku-ring-gai's dilemma in providing additional new housing, particularly along the environmentally sensitive railway/highway corridor and St Ives, without further compromising Ku-ring-gai's natural and built heritage".

FOKE also sought assurances on the promise by former Premier and member for Ku-ring-gai Mr Barry O'Farrell's that that the maximum number of new dwellings by 2031 in Ku-ring-gai would remain at 10,000. Mr Henskens said that he "would not be boxed in" about the dwelling numbers.

As well FOKE put forward concerns about the serious loss of trees from the flawed 10/50 Vegetation Code; the failure of Private Certification; the urgent need for a recovery plan for the Blue Gum High Forest; inappropriate recreational zoning within Sheldon Forest; the community's opposition to pressures for amalgamating Ku-ringgai and Hornsby Council; the need for innovative planning protections for Ku-ringgai village centres; and the sale of community lands.

FOKE President Kathy Cowley said, "It was reassuring for FOKE to know that Mr Henskens recognised that his community was passionate about protecting Ku-ringgai as one of Sydney's most significant environmentally sensitive areas. Mr Henskens acknowledged that Ku-ring-gai's heritage and environment had been recognised by many eminent and qualified persons and institutions".
