Do you believe dwelling supply alone will solve the housing shortage and affordability? NO

Do you support Ku-ring-gai Council's legal action against the NSW Government's Transport Orientated Development (TOD) SEPP? I don't have the details to comment on this action. But as a general view, I believe the council should be given the opportunity to plan and action for a state government's desired outcome.

- 1. What motivated you to run for office at the Ku-ring-gai local government elections? The desire to have my children grow up in a safe and comfortable environment and to preserve the living standard of Ku-ring-gai residents.
 - 2. What is your vision for Ku-ring-gai?

A council that perfectly embodies the blend of community, culture, and convenience. A close-knit community with natural surroundings. A vibrant multicultural infusion of art and ethnic restaurants that celebrate cultural festivals and strive for creativity and inclusivity. Within the tranquil setting, local business activities are convenient and affordable and small business owners collaborate, fostering growth and innovation. Well-maintained roads and well-connected public transport, children can safely ride bikes to school, and seniors stroll to the nearby community centre. A council is desired by families and retirees alike.

3. What life experiences and professional experiences do you bring that will serve in your role as a councillor?

- 5. How do you propose to address those issues if elected?

- I. Reducing the burden of the rising cost of living by providing community batteries for residents without rooftop solar and encouraging rooftop solar uptake both funded by government grant. Establish community buses to reduce residents' travel time and expenses. improving residents' quality of life, and boosting local business activities.
- II. Prioritizing residents' physical and mental health, including pedestrian and traffic safety, children's mental health counselling, domestic violence prevention, and crime reduction.
- III. Emphasizing heritage and environmental protection, promoting the use of green energy equipment, promote share economic, installing community energy storage facilities and electric vehicle charging stations.
- 6. How will you ensure community engagement, and participation?

Ensuring community engagement and participation can be achieved through several key initiatives. Promoting multicultural community events in and around schools fosters inclusivity and cultural exchange, enriching the educational environment. Interacting with and supporting local sports clubs, as well as sponsoring non-profit community organizations, strengthens community ties and provides valuable resources for growth.
